

CRRA Hartford Landfill Expression of Interest for Soils

The Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority (CRRA) is in the process of closing its Hartford Landfill. The final phase of closure is expected to begin in 2011 and CRRA is now accepting regulated fill soils (acceptance criteria attached), and clean fill (as defined in RCSA 22a-209-1) to grade the landfill in preparation for the final cap in that area. CRRA currently has capacity for several tens of thousands of cubic yards and can provide competitive disposal rates for such fill.

Because this material will be placed underneath the synthetic membrane cover, CRRA will consider soils that exceed the I/C RSR standard. In this case, CTDEP approval as a special waste will be required.

Additionally, CRRA may accept topsoil and sand materials meeting RDEC and GBPMC at no charge, provided such materials meet certain physical specifications.
