Dear Governor Malloy:

This is the quarterly report of operations of the Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority (the "Authority") for the 2nd Quarter of Fiscal Year 2012 (October 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011) as required by Connecticut General Statutes Section 22a-263 (the "Statute").

The Authority is responsible for implementing solid waste disposal and resource recovery systems and facilities throughout the State of Connecticut (the "State") in accordance with the State Solid Waste Management Plan. The Authority is comprised of separate and distinct, comprehensive solid waste disposal project systems located throughout the State. Therefore, the Statute requirements are reported separately for each project. Please be advised that the Bridgeport Project expired on December 31, 2008 when the Bridgeport Project bonds matured and ownership of the Bridgeport facility was transferred to Wheelabrator. On January 1, 2009, the Authority created the SouthWest Division to service 12 of the former 18 Bridgeport Project towns to provide solid waste disposal capacity on their behalf at the former Bridgeport facility. Furthermore, on June 30, 2010 the Wallingford Project expired and this facility is now owned and operated by Covanta.
